denying his emotional state during teaching opportunities. He is now more comfortable talking about his emotions with a trusted adult. His communication skills have improved, and he can now share feelings and requests even when something is really bothering him and when he is dysregulated.

Our ABC of NC team tailors activities to Danny's learner profile to ensure he is successful, happy, relaxed, and engaged. ABC of NC provides Danny with the supports and opportunities to reach his full potential while learning in a fun, safe, and inclusive environment.

# letter from a Program Supervisor

**It's hard to put into words what it's like to feel purpose.** I can't quite explain it, but I do know that I am privileged to know the feeling. More importantly, I get the chance to help make their lives better and alleviate suffering to make way for fulfillment. With that responsibility comes immense pressure. However, it's good pressure. It's good because it's incredibly meaningful.

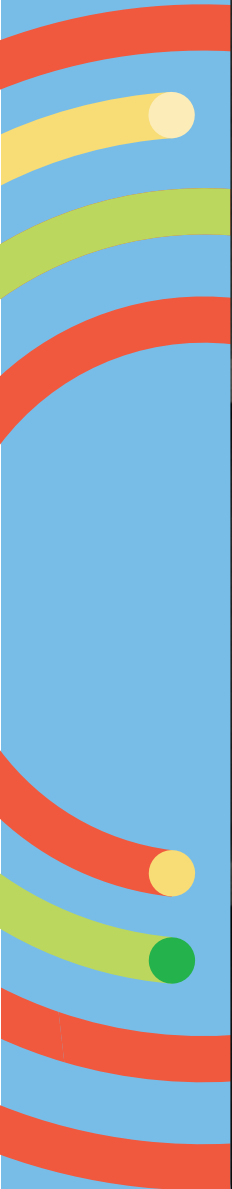
Over the last few years at ABC of NC, I've learned to wear many different hats, and I really had to grow up professionally. Looking back, I was so naive in my early days as a registered behavior technician (RBT). Thankfully, I've always had a natural clinical intuition, but I've realized there is a world of possibility that was totally untapped. Some of that knowledge I would learn from textbooks and coursework, but most of what I've learned can't be found in text—it had to be learned from my clients. Clinical success resides in the nuances of individuality and developing a sincere understanding of the person you're supporting. I have never seen anything more carefully personalized than the applied behavior analysis therapy (ABA) and educational program at ABC of NC. As I've developed from an RBT to a newly licensed behavior analyst, I've made it a point to hold the value of individualization at the forefront of everything I do.

What's best about individualization as a practice is that it's infinitely more effective. When our clients succeed, we

get to revel in the small role we played to help them get there. Whether it is helping a child learn their first words or getting a young adult ready for college, there is always another milestone on the horizon. In addition to those big successes, we have the day-to-day experiences that are equally important parts of the process. It wasn't until working at ABC of NC that I truly learned the value of a smile. One smile might seem insignificant, but our lives are really just an amalgamation of tiny moments. To be able to influence the quality of those moments and make them more joyful for our clients is a tremendously fulfilling responsibility when you are working with someone on the spectrum.

ABC of NC is a microcosm for the conscientious betterment of the field of ABA. Minding the complexity of an ever-evolving landscape, I can only offer my account and what our ABA practice means to me—a unique space where science meets hope. It's a space where intellectual inquiry meets child-like curiosity; where rigor and technicality meet well-being. Social change starts within each individual, as they embrace and embody the principles and behaviors that make for a more equitable and inclusive society. There will be a day for each of our clients when it is time for them to move on from our services to the greater world. We are unrelenting in our efforts to ensure a world where they are appreciated and loved for their differences, not in spite of them.

**Becoming a board certified behavior analyst (BCBA) was not my plan after high school.** The title BCBA is not a very well-known term or profession, but I am biased and think it should be! I stumbled upon ABC of NC in college while looking to learn more about autism. I had a recently diagnosed family member and had to assist my family in navigating the autism world, all while translating and interpreting it into Spanish. I became an ABC of NC volunteer and quickly realized this was it—working with individuals on the spectrum was the career for me! I wanted to make an impact not only in the Autistic community but also in helping the Spanish-speaking community navigate this world of autism.

After I graduated with my bachelor’s degree, I immediately began working at ABC of NC as a registered behavior technician (RBT). I took one year to learn more about applied behavior analysis and to ensure I wanted to become a board certified behavior analyst (BCBA). After one year of working in the field, I was sure! My time as an RBT confirmed the immense need for BCBAs, specifically Spanish-speaking BCBAs. With letters of recommendation from ABC of NC, I applied to The University of North Carolina at Charlotte and was accepted into their master of education program with a concentration in applied behavior analysis.

During my last year of graduate school, ABC of NC began offering the Burress-Brenner Employee Scholarship Program. As all BCBAs know, working full time,

gaining those fieldwork hours, and completing coursework are stressful. I decided to apply, hoping to ease some of my financial strain. I was so happy to receive the scholarship and grateful that ABC of NC chose to invest in me. Receiving the scholarship allowed me the freedom to focus on coursework and gain my final fieldwork hours. After graduation, I sat for my BCBA exam and finally achieved my goal of becoming a BCBA.

ABC of NC helped me find my passion for the Autistic community. Here, I learned that what I loved the most about working in this field is not the impact I am having on the clients but the impact the clients and their families are having on me.

Watching our clients reach goals and be happy is the best feeling. ABC of NC has helped mold me into the BCBA I am today and has been a safe space for me to grow in my career. The organization continues to support my professional growth and my wishes to be a helpful resource for Spanish-speaking families who have Autistic loved ones.

I am excited for ABC of NC to continue offering the Burress-Brenner Employee Scholarship, as there is a great need for more BCBAs. This scholarship program will support other people motivated to work in this field while improving service accessibility for our community.

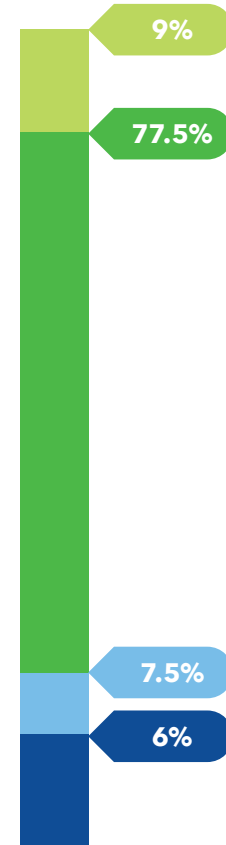

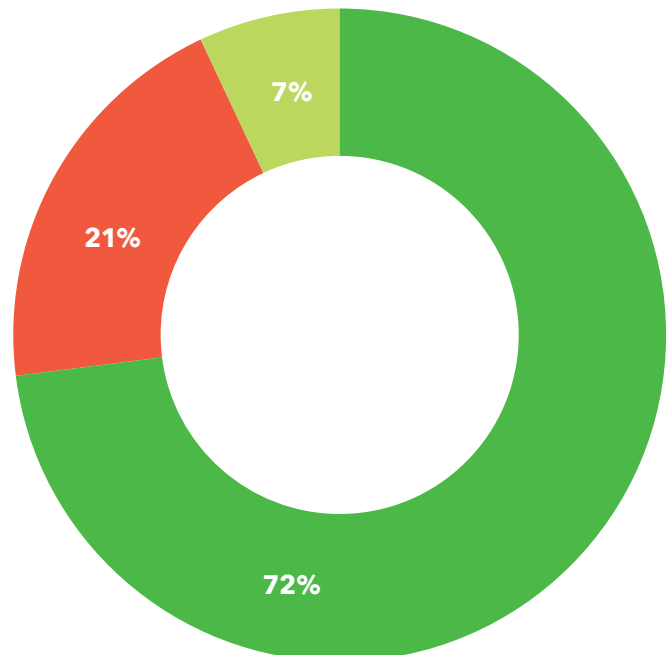
